

## Bible Reading for the Week of May 31, 2026

### **Monday, June 1 – John 4:1-29**

How does this story present Jesus as the bridegroom of his people? Where else in John's gospel have we seen that emphasis? How might this story have been different from the cultural norms of Jesus' day? How does Jesus' confrontation with the woman strike at the cultural norms of our day? As you pray, spend time praising the Lord for satisfying your deepest longings in the Lord Jesus.

### **Tuesday, June 2 – John 4:1-29**

What do we learn about new covenant worship from this story, especially in verses 20-24? How does new covenant worship differ from old covenant worship? How is it similar? Give thanks to the Lord for the privilege to worship the Lord each week with the community of the redeemed.

### **Wednesday, June 3 – John 4:30-45**

What do we learn about evangelism from the story of the woman at the well? How does Jesus' interaction with her cause her to spread the news concerning him? Is there anyone in your life that the Lord has placed a burden on your heart to share Christ's gospel? Take time today to pray for that individual.

### **Thursday, June 4 – Joshua 7:1-26**

How does this story concerning the sin of Achan highlight the gravity of sin? How do we see in this story that sin has consequences for other people? Can you think of a scenario in your life when your sin impacted those around you? As you pray today, be sure to confess your sins before the Lord, knowing that he will forgive those who confess them before him.

### **Friday, June 5 – Joshua 7:1-26**

How might this story of the sin of Achan relate to discipline in the life of the church? Why do you think church discipline is practiced so little in many churches? Why is church discipline an important means by which God grows the church? Take time to pray for the leaders of the church who have been tasked with overseeing the spiritual life of the people of God.

### **Saturday, June 6 – Joshua 7:1-26**

The story of Achan reminds us that the Lord treats what is holy with special care. How might this impact the way that we use our bodies, which the apostle Paul describes as temples of the Holy Spirit? How does Achan's story convince us to take seriously the holy worship of God on the Lord's Day? Take time today to prepare for corporate worship tomorrow, and pray that the Lord would cause you to grow under the preaching of his word.
