

Bible Reading for the Week of June 7, 2026

Monday, June 8 – John 4:16-26

How does new covenant worship relate to old covenant worship, according to Jesus' instruction to the woman at the well? How might these principles reflect the church's universal growth after the time of Pentecost? Give thanks to the Lord for the privilege of worshiping him each week.

Tuesday, June 9 – Hebrews 12:18-29

What is the true context for the church's corporate gathering? How does this relate to the church's worship under the old covenant? How should we contemplate coming before God in worship (see verses 28-29)? Pray that the Spirit of God would cultivate within you a heart to worship the Lord sincerely.

Wednesday, June 10 – Romans 12:1-2

How does weekly, corporate worship relate to the calling of the Christian every day? How might our corporate worship help and fuel our individual worship? Give thanks to the Lord this day for the grace and mercy he has shown you in Jesus Christ.

Thursday, June 11 – Joshua 8:1-29

What are some of the ways in which chapter 8 contrasts chapter 7? How does the removal of sin from the camp of Israel impact Israel's fighting with Ai in chapter 8? Pray that the Lord would reveal your sin to you, in order that you might confess it before him.

Friday, June 12 – Joshua 8:1-29

We have considered how the sin of Achan in chapter 7 relates to new covenant discipline in the context of the church. In terms of Achan's old covenant excommunication, how might this act of discipline have impacted Israel moving forward? How might an instance of church discipline impact the church after the fact? Take some time today to pray for the spiritual leaders in the church, and ask the Lord to give them wisdom as they shepherd the flock of Christ.

Saturday, June 13 – Joshua 8:30-35

What is the role of this covenant renewal service in the life of the people of God? How might the church's weekly gathering for worship relate to this covenant renewal service? Pray that the Lord would prepare your heart today to worship him tomorrow.
