

Bible Reading for the Week of August 2, 2026

Monday, August 3 – John 6:16-21

Based on the description of verse 18, what kind of thoughts would have been going through the minds of the disciples? Why might the presence of Jesus give the disciples reason not to be afraid? How might the knowledge of Christ help you not grow anxious when life's circumstances are full of fear? Pray that the Lord would calm your anxious heart with the knowledge of his presence.

Tuesday, August 4 – John 6:15-21

How does this passage reveal something about Christ's divinity? Can you think of any Old Testament passages where God is described as walking upon the waters? Take time today to praise the Lord for his power and strength to redeem lost sinners.

Wednesday, August 5 – Isaiah 40:9-11

Who is called to herald good news in these verses? How is the Lord portrayed by Isaiah? How are these verses fulfilled in the Lord Jesus? Praise the Lord today for the might and care of the Lord Jesus as our warrior-shepherd.

Thursday, August 6 – Joshua 15:1-19

Where do we first learn about Caleb in the Bible? How is he portrayed as faithful to God in this and other passages? Pray that the Lord would cause you to remain faithful to him, even if you must stand alone.

Friday, August 7– Joshua 15:20-63

What is the significance of the tribe of Judah in biblical history? How does the tribe of Judah relate to the coming Messiah? Take a moment to give thanks to the Lord for sending the lion of the tribe of Judah to conquer his and our enemies by means of the cross.

Saturday, August 8 – Joshua 16:1-10

Despite the people inheriting the land, verse 10 indicates they did not drive everyone out. How is this an act of disobedience on the part of Israel? How does this relate to the opening chapter of the book of Judges? Pray the Lord would prepare your heart to meet with him in worship tomorrow.
