

Bible Reading for the Week of September 27, 2026

Monday, September 28 – Mark 14:22-25

How does the Lord's Supper relate to the Old Testament Passover? How might this hermeneutical point also relate to the other New Covenant sacrament, namely, baptism? What Old Testament sign does baptism relate to? How do the sacraments remind us of the work of Christ? Give thanks to the Lord for his word, and the signs that accompany his word.

Tuesday, September 29 – Mark 14:22-25

What is the significance of Jesus saying "*this is the blood of the covenant*" (vs. 24)? What Old Testament passage might Jesus be thinking about? Praise the Lord today that he has welcomed you into his covenant through Jesus Christ.

Wednesday, September 30 – Mark 14:22-25

How does the sacrament of the Lord's Supper relate to the past, present, and future? Take time to meditate on the significance of each of those, and give thanks to the Lord for the truths bound up in each.

Thursday, October 1 – Joshua 24:1-33

How does Joshua use Israel's prior history to encourage the people in the present? How might this principle apply to our own lives as members of the church? Can you think of past scenarios of God's provision that can help you in the present? Give thanks to the Lord for the greatness of his faithfulness.

Friday, October 2 – Joshua 24:1-33

What are the two paths laid out for God's people? What are the promises that will occur as a result of obedience? What are the promises that will occur as a result of disobedience? Pray that the Lord would cause you to be faithful to his commands.

Saturday, October 3 – Joshua 24:1-33

How does this covenant renewal ceremony relate to the previous covenants that God had made with his people? How might this covenant renewal relate to the church in the new covenant? Take time to pray for the Spirit's work to prepare your heart for worship tomorrow.
